

In the Morin Gallery: The Glass Basket

Opening Reception: Thursday, December 6 from 5-7pm

Exhibit Dates: Dec 6, 2012 - Jan 25, 2013

Although art and glass have existed since the stone ages, *Art Glass* was born in the mid 1800s, with artist designers and glass blowers cooperating to explore different colors, patterns, and textures. The subsequent melding of artistry and technique resulted in a wide variety of beautiful handmade objects such as vases, lampshades, bowls, bottles, paperweights and figural works.

This exhibit will explore the basket form. From vasa murrhina to amberina, opaline to opalescent, satin to spattered and speckled, the exhibit provides a comprehensive look at the variety of surface treatments applied during the Victorian and Art Nouveau era by Bohemian, Czech, Italian, French, English and American artisans including:

A GALLERY *can be much more than an* EXHIBIT

In October and November The Arts Center's Morin Gallery exhibited *Spirit & Soul*, paintings by artists Carol Barber and Eddie Thiel. Eddie Thiel's paintings are interpretations of Native American Plains Indian ledger art. They are full of symbolism and they tell stories. Arts Center board member Sharon Mohrmann, also an Orange County Public School teacher, was quick to see an opportunity for second graders to enrich their SOL mandated study of the Plains Indians with a visit to the gallery.



Orange Elementary School's second graders have been painting and building their own interpretations of Lakota horses after being inspired by the beautiful exhibit of Eddie Thiel's paintings at the Art Center. They have put them on display at www.artsonia.com/schools/orange17 Please, take a look!

So, they came, five classes of second graders from Orange Elementary and five classes from Unionville Elementary. They came, they opened up their bright little minds, they looked at the paintings, they identified the symbols and they talked about the stories. Then they went back to school and created their own art, full of their own symbols. It is a safe bet that none will forget the lesson.

OC second graders weren't the only ones to enjoy, explore and interpret Thiel's paintings. The Arts Fusion program from the Central & Western Virginia Alzheimer's Association has recently partnered with the Arts Center's Community Outreach to offer gallery visits and art activities to those suffering from Alzheimer's and their caregivers. Residents from The Village at Gordon House have visited the Morin Gallery twice, to view both the VA H2O exhibit and the *Spirit & Soul* exhibit featuring Thiel and Barber's work.


Under the direction of the Arts Fusion specialist, Campbell Echols, residents from The Village at Gordon House have viewed the exhibits hanging in the Morin Gallery and engaged in discussion, with theme based questions designed by Echols to promote group

interaction. Each visit is also immediately followed up with an art or poetry exploration with Echols, based on the inspiration that the artwork hanging in the gallery provides. This last visit was particularly touching, as the residents burst into spontaneous song while sharing their bits of poetry during the poetry building exercise. Orange Senior Center centered a full afternoon around their visit to The Arts Center. After close examination and discussion concerning the paintings in the gallery as a group, each member took a private moment to garner inspiration from the paintings. The seniors then worked intensely in the classroom studio on clay medallions, drawing upon nature to create intricate works of art, honoring both the spirit and the soul. At the other end of the age spectrum, very young Early Head Starters from the Orange County Head Start Program came with their mothers and group leaders for a tour and gallery visit, led by Outreach artist Wendy Wiebe. After viewing and briefly discussing the exhibit in the Morin Gallery, Wiebe then instructed them in an art project designed to compliment the *Spirit & Soul* exhibit. Using glue and multi-colored sand, along with scratch tools, the very young, budding artists worked side by side with their mothers in a free-flowing art exercise.
